GIRAFFES, TIGERS & SPIDER MONKEYS MOVING IN NEXT YEAR!

Giraffe tongues are dark blue or purple and can be up to 20 inches long!

Spider monkeys have a long prehensile tail that they use as fifth limb to swing from tree to tree.

A tiger's roar can be heard from nearly 2 miles away!

Giraffes have the same amount of bones in their neck as humans — just 7!

When spider monkeys meet, they hug each other to say hello!

The oldest fossil remains of tigers are believed to be 2 million years old!

Spider monkeys live in groups, called troops, of over 30 monkeys.

Tigers can leap up to 32 feet in a single bound!

Tigers are the largest wild cats in the world. Adults can weigh up to 800 pounds!

Just like snowflakes and fingerprints, no two giraffes spots are alike.

A giraffe's feet are 12 inches wide — as big as a dinner plate!

Unlike many primates, spider monkeys do not have thumbs.
