












MEET TOBAI!



eet Tobai, a male Matschie's tree kangaroo joey and one of the newest members of the Lincoln Children's Zoo family. Tobai was born around May 3, 2022 to mom, Judie, and dad, Bexley. Tobai is one of only four Matschie's tree kangaroos born in 2022 in zoos accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA).

The Zoo has an exceptional breeding program for Matschie's tree kangaroos. In fact, 33% of North America's Matschie's tree kangaroos are descended from our Lincoln Children's Zoo breeding program. This is an incredible accomplishment and important for animal conservation efforts considering the decrease of the tree kangaroo population in the wild.

When Matschie's tree kangaroos are born, they are the size of a lima bean. They blindly crawl into mom's pouch where they nurse and continue to develop and grow. They start to open their eyes around 21 weeks and a few weeks



after that they will start poking their head out of the pouch. At 28 weeks old they will start to come out of the pouch and explore. At 40 weeks they will no longer be in the pouch, but will still stick their heads in to nurse.

Matschie's tree kangaroos are only found on the Huon Peninsula of Papua New Guinea. They are listed as Endangered on the International Union Conservation of Nature's (IUCN) Red List of Threatened Species, meaning they face a very high risk of extinction in the wild.

The Lincoln Children's Zoo is part of the Association of Zoos and Aquariums' Species Survival Plan Program. The program develops a Breeding and Transfer Plan which identifies population goals and recommendations to manage a genetically diverse, demographically varied, and biologically sound population. The plan's coordinators approved breeding recommendations for the Zoo's tree kangaroos Judie and Bexley.

Judie and Tobai are currently on exhibit in the Animal Kingdom Building. Tobai still spends some of his time in his mother's pouch so he might not always be visible, but as he grows he continues to spend more and more time outside of the pouch.

The Zoo is so excited to be partnering with KultureCity® to enhance our ability to assist and accommodate guests with sensory needs. Lincoln Children's Zoo is the first Certified Sensory Inclusive site in Nebraska.

we can help those with sensory needs feel welcomed and included," said Evan Killeen, Lincoln Children's Zoo CEO.

Sensory sensitivities or challenges with sensory regulation are often experienced by individuals with autism, dementia, PTSD and other similar conditions. One of the major barriers for these individuals is sensitivity to over stimulation and noise, which can be a major part of the events or services at an organization like Lincoln Children's Zoo. With its new certification, the Zoo is now better prepared to assist guests with sensory sensitivities in

having the most comfortable and accommodating experience possible.

KultureCity® is a leading non-profit recognized nationwide for using its resources to revolutionize and effect change in the community for those with sensory needs, not just those with autism. Since the program's inception, KultureCity® has created over 1,000 Sensory Inclusive™ public and private services, organizations, events and venues in 6 countries: this includes special events such as the NFL Pro-Bowl, NFL Super Bowl, MLB World Series, and MLB All Star Weekend.

What does this mean?

This means that guests of all ages with sensory needs can now access the following:

- Sensory bags equipped with noise-cancelling headphones, fidget tools, and verbal cue cards are now available for checkout at no cost at Tree Top Toys.
- Weighted lap pads are also available for checkout at no cost at Tree Top Toys.
- Headphone Zones are now labeled with signage to prepare guests for louder areas of the Zoo.
- Designated Quiet Zone's are available to help decompress when feeling overstimulated.
- Staff that is trained and certified in how to identify and assist those with sensory needs.
- The free KultureCity® App includes information on where you can access the sensory features available at the Zoo, as well as a social story which will provide a customized visual preview of what to expect when visiting the Zoo.
